### DAMASCUS, VIRGINIA, TRAIL TOWN USA

We have some of the best outdoor recreation of the Southeast right in our backyard. There's an adventure for everyone here! The **Appalachian Trail** and **Virginia Creeper Trail** pass right through the heart of Damascus, along with several other long distance hiking, cycling, and motor routes. At the edge of town, **Mount Rogers National Recreation Area** stretches as far as the eye can see, across the highest peaks in the state, over high elevation mountain balds and spruce-fir forests, trout streams, and more than 500 miles of trails. Here you'll find the five highest peaks in Virginia, all at over 5,000 feet in elevation: **Mount Rogers, Whitetop Mountain, Pine Mountain, Buzzard Rock, and Haw Orchard Mountain**.

The **trail town lifestyle** in Damascus is adventurous and creative, yet relaxed. Stop and stay awhile in our vibrant downtown, where everyone is treated like a local. **Take the time to explore all that Damascus has to offer.** From the many trails, parks, and public lands, to our shops and restaurants downtown, there is an adventure for everyone here. ### THE APPALACHIAN TRAIL DAYS FESTIVAL

**Trail Days is the biggest event of the year in Damascus and the world's largest celebration of the Appalachian Trail and hiker culture!** Each year in May, the town swells to an estimated 25,000 people for the festival. You can expect a grand reunion of thru-hikers past and present, over a hundred vendors of handmade goods and some of the best outdoor gear in the industry, a packed schedule of live music and events, and a large crowd of trail supporters and hiking enthusiasts. Trail Days is always the weekend after Mother's Day. The Town-wide Yard Sale is always the weekend before Trail Days. Trail Days is free to attend; there is a fee at Tent City.

### GENERAL INFORMATION

- Find the **Town Information Tent and First Aid Station** by the Town Park Stage.
- **Live Music:** There are FREE concerts at the Town Park Stage all weekend. Bring your own lawn/camping chair or picnic blanket and stay awhile.
- Alcohol is prohibited in all public spaces. Attendees may drink responsibly in designated areas.
- **ATM locations in town:** App. Heritage Distillery, Bank of Damascus, Cowboys, Country Corner, and Food City.
- **Ride Board:** To request or offer a ride to or from Trail Days, post in the **Trail Days Ride Board** group on Facebook. The Damascus Trail Center will also have an in-person ride board to post offers and requests.
- **Content Creators**: Pick up your Trail Days media kit and talking points at the Town Info Tent!
- Share your Trail Days photos with us! Use hashtags #VisitDamascus, #TrailDays, and #TrailTownUSA or tag the Appalachian Trail Days Festival pages on Facebook and Instagram.

### FREE EVENT SHUTTLE

- **Trail Days Shuttle**: The free shuttle bus is **provided by People Inc.** Use this shuttle to get around Trail Days! Shuttle stops are shown on the centerfold map and marked with yard signs around town.
- **Shuttle Hours:** are Thursday 1-5pm, Friday 10am-10pm, Saturday 10am-10pm, and Sunday 10am-5pm.
- Rules: Stay seated while the bus is moving. No open containers, no tobacco products, no smoking or vaping.

### PARKING

- Public parking cannot accommodate oversized vehicles, trailers, RVs, or campers during Trail Days. This includes Tent City, the Town Park, downtown, and the long-term lots.
- Please be considerate of our residents and do not park on private property unless you have permission.
- Paid parking is available by Tent City at 1011 S Shady Ave, Damascus VA 24236. \$20 per car, CASH ONLY.
- The Wilson St lot by the Library is CLOSED to public parking. This area is reserved for vendor parking only.
- The town of Damascus is **highly walk-able and bike-able**. Once you find a place to park, we recommend that you travel by foot, bike, and/or shuttle as much as possible. If you are staying overnight, please try to leave your vehicle at your lodging.

### EVENT INFO

### TENT CITY (IOII S SHADY AVE)

Tent City is a large walk-in camping area provided by the Town of Damascus during Trail Days. There are no advance reservations and camping is first come, first served. Tent City has restrooms/portajohns and dumpsters nearby. Firewood is provided.

- An **entrance fee is required** to enter, whether you are camping or not.
- Wristbands are good for the whole weekend: Thursday is \$20 per person, Friday \$15, and Saturday \$10.
- Tent City is **CASH ONLY**. We do have an option to **pay by Square via QR code** with a processing fee of \$1 per person. This option is only available if you have cell service and can show proof of receipt at the gate.
- Opens at 9am Thursday and closes 6pm Sunday. If you arrive early or stay late, you will be asked to leave.
- No vehicles may be taken into the camping area. There is a \$200 fine for vehicles driven onto the field.
- Tent city is **pet-friendly** for friendly pets. Please keep pets on a leash and clean up any waste.
- **Town-wide quiet hours** begin at midnight on Friday and 1am on Saturday. No exceptions.

### HIKER PARADE

- The parade is at 2pm. Parade line-up is at 1:30pm by Sundog Outfitter. The parade ends at the Town Park.
- Water balloons are not allowed but **super soakers** are very much encouraged! The Town expects participants to use caution and common sense.
- **Do not spray water on anyone preceding the hikers**, to include those in uniform such as the Honor Guard and Police. Do not spray water on other parade participants such as trail maintenance clubs, beauty pageant queens, scout troops, etc...unless they have a super soaker too!
- Alcohol is prohibited in all public spaces. This includes the Hiker Parade and Town Park.

## DANIEL BYRD'S BOOGIE MACHINE

3:00-5:00 at the Town Park Stage

Daniel Byrd (Folkfaces, Magus and the Movers) has called the blues his home for the better part of his life. Singer-songwriter, guitarist, harmonica player, and instrument tech, Byrd's passion and musical savvy make him hard to miss in the Tri-Cities. While his solo work lends more to soul-driven folk and Americana, his band Daniel Byrd's Boogie Machine is a heavier-hitting, funkier creation altogether.

Formerly "Boogie Collective," his Boogie Machine, featuring Jacob Tipton (Loose Leaves) on bass, and Kip Borodzik (ADC, Flame Azalea) on drums, is aptly billed as Groovy Blues and Electric Soul for the People. Daniel Byrd's Boogie Machine can be found playing local venues, such as Johnson City's Capone's and The Hideaway, Kingsport's Gypsy Circus Cider Company, and Model City Tap House. The band is currently working on new and inspired creative collaborations, as well as recording their first full-length album.


# THE ALABAMA HEATHENS 8:00-10:00 at the Town Park Stage
